

- 4D. **Sewer Report:** Chairman Mason made a report on the sewage activity. He stated the sludge will be removed from the sewage pond by the operator. The bird balls will be blown away from the water so sludge can be pumped out. Dredging of the pond is necessary every three to four years. Also, Technivate will do the work necessary for the pavers into the Pump Station at the Estates of Londonbrook.
- 5A. **Signal 88 Security:** Peter Mango of Signal 88 Security gave a presentation of their service. He asked the board to consider allowing a roving patrol. The Board would need to change the condition that is now in place for the R.J. Waters Shoppes at Jenners Village. The roving patrol would be for 13 hours. The patrol would be three times an hour. This would take place in the shopping center. The operation is computerized and all elements are posted by computer. Everything is online and the Township can access this information. Vice-Chairman Marcello stated she was not comfortable with not having 24-hour surveillance. Also, she questioned the time intervals with the three times per hour. Peter Mango stated they were on site 8 to 10 minutes, approximately every 20 minutes.

Chairman Mason asked what would be the patrol area. Peter Mango stated he would come back on November 4, 2009 with more details.

- 5B. **VPP Grant Contract:** Supervisor Finnen stated that the proposal was sent into the County. Work on the project could begin in January.
- 6A. **Big Elk Extension:** Chairman Mason read the Extension Request for the Big Elk Associates. Supervisor Bram made a motion to approve the Extension request to November 21, 2009 as requested. Seconded by Vice-Chairman Marcello – all in favor.
- 7A. **Act 32 Commission Alternate:** Supervisor Mantegna made a motion to appoint Larry L. Davis as a voting member of the Act 32 Commission. Seconded by Vice-Chairman Marcello – all in favor.
- 7B. **Retention Resolution:** Chairman Mason went over the letter from the Solicitor dated September 29, 2009 in regard to record retention. Supervisor Mantegna made a motion to adopt Resolution 2009-15, which allows Penn Township to dispose of records according to statutory requirements. Seconded by Vice-Chairman Marcello – all in favor.
8. **Pole Saw Trimmer:** Supervisor Bram made a motion to have the Office Manager purchase a quality pole saw trimmer. Seconded by Supervisor Mantegna – all in favor.

Supervisor Finnen asked the Supervisors to enter into the National Salute a Vet on Veteran's Day. Supervisor Bram made a motion that the Board of Supervisors of Penn Township wish to salute all veterans and recognize Chester County's Veteran's on this Veteran's Day. Seconded by Supervisor Finnen – all in favor.

Public Comments: Jim Plyler asked about the new park proposal. He asked to see the documentation on this issue. Chairman Mason stated he should fill out an Open Records Request Form. Chairman Mason stated most of the information would be with the Recreation Committee Engineers. The Committee would be responsible, because they have not presented the plans to the Board of Supervisors. Jim Plyler asked about the funding were would it be coming from? Chairman Mason stated DCNR Grant. Mr. Plyler stated he would attend the next Recreation Meeting and would like to see all minutes of past meetings.

Supervisor Mantegna made a motion to adjourn. Seconded by Vice-Chairman Marcello – all in favor.
